

University of Denver Task Force Evaluation:

Researchers at the University of Denver provide evaluation of DATA as part of the ECM Grant.

Surveys are administered to track participants' perceptions of group interactions, achievement, and communication. Results indicate participants view the Task Force as effective and that DATA allows for interaction and connection with key agencies and individuals. Researchers then conduct qualitative interviews with task force participants to identify strengths and areas for opportunity. These findings are shared with DATA administration to inform efforts and operations.



Collaboration Spotlight: Sullentrop -Warner Case

Over the course of three years, the Denver District Attorney's Office (DDA) investigated and successfully prosecuted the Sullentrop-Warner labor trafficking case. After a thorough investigation and prosecution, Sullentrop-Warner was charged with involuntary servitude and sentenced to 10 years. The survivor was consulted consistently to ensure justice and a favorable case outcome. Partner organizations, [Alight](#) and [Covered](#) provided for the survivor's legal and case management needs. The survivor worked with Alight on complex and intertwined legal needs including custody and the disillusion of marriage. Covered offered multiple services such as housing, counseling, and support throughout the legal proceedings and beyond.

This case received the recognition and support necessary to ensure the survivors both safety and pursuit of justice. DATA thanks the collaborative and invested approach of all partner agencies.
